Garfield School will be practicing our earthquake and tsunami drill during the North Coast Tsunami Drill on **Wednesday, March 26th at 11:00**. Garfield staff and students will practice our earthquake drill followed by briefly evacuating the classrooms. We will also be sending a message, via the District's automated communication system, letting everyone know that we are all safe!

What we learned from the earthquake we experienced back in December:

- We learned that Garfield is safe from the initial impact of a tsunami because Garfield School is not in the Tsunami Zone
- We were reminded that the tsunami zone maps were created for worst case scenarios This means that even if there is a tsunami warning and the area included in the warning includes Garfield School we are still safe from the initial impacts of a tsunami.
- We realized that because we had a plan in place, students felt very safe during this event.
- We came to understand that the biggest risks involved families driving through tsunami zones in order to be with loved ones.
